Are you interested in participating in the Planned Giving Round Table of Northern Nevada (PGRT), but working on a small budget? Are you new to planned giving and want to learn more? Apply for a PGRT Scholarship today!

Overview

The PGRT Membership Scholarship is for nonprofit professionals, small-shop and independent allied professionals, or fundraising/allied professionals new to the field of planned giving. The PGRT Membership Scholarship **provides for the recipient a one-year PGRT membership, valid for 12 months from the date of the award.** By accepting the PGRT Membership Scholarship, the recipient agrees to regularly attend PGRT events and consider involvement and support in the efforts of one of PGRT's Committees (Membership, Marketing and Communications, and Programming) during their scholarship.

Applications are due 5.00PM, November 1, 2019.

Selection & Award Process

Scholarship recipients will be chosen at PGRT's November Board Meeting. Recipients will be notified ahead of PGRT's December Holiday Party/Annual Meeting and will be announced to the community at that gathering. Awarded scholarships will commence on January 1 the following year and will be valid January 1, 2020 through December 31, 2020.

Criteria & Eligibility

- Applications are open to all nonprofit and allied professionals (attorneys, financial planners, accountants, trust officers)
- Applicants must have a demonstrated interest in gift planning or are seeking to further their scope of understanding in the field of gift planning
- Applicants must have been in their current position for at least one year
- Preference will be given to nonprofit and allied professionals who are either new to the field or actively seeking work in gift planning fundraising and also those working with small operating budgets
- Preference will be given to individuals who have not previously received a PGRT scholarship
- Preference will be given to individuals who are not current members of PGRT (note: past members are eligible)
- Only one individual per organization may receive a scholarship per year
- Applicants must commit to attending at least two PGRT programs and two PGRT-hosted social mixers during the year
- At the conclusion of the year, scholarship recipients will be encouraged to maintain their membership with PGRT
