Are you interested in participating in the Planned Giving Round Table of Northern Nevada (PGRT), but working on a small or reduced budget? Are you new to planned giving and want to learn more? Apply for a PGRT Scholarship today!

Overview

Thanks to the generosity of the PGRT Board and other sponsors, PGRT Scholarships are available for nonprofit professionals, small-shop and independent allied professionals, or fundraising/allied professionals new to the field of planned giving. **PGRT offers three types of scholarship and each provides the recipient with a one-year PGRT membership, valid for 12 months from the date of the award.** By accepting a PGRT Scholarship, the recipient agrees to regularly attend PGRT events and consider involvement and support in the efforts of one of PGRT's Committees (Membership, Marketing and Communications, and Programming) during their scholarship.

Scholarship Options

1. PGRT Board Scholarship

Number Available: Up to 5 (five)

Application Deadline: December 1, 2020

Criteria: For first-time/new members only

2. Financial Assistance Scholarship

Number Available: Up to 10 (ten)

Application Deadline: Ongoing

Criteria: For members and non members whose organizations or businesses have reduced or cut professional membership dues from budgets

3. General PGRT Scholarship

Number Available: Variable

Application Deadline: Ongoing

Criteria: For first-time/new members only

Selection & Award Process

All PGRT Scholarship recipients will be reviewed by PGRT's Scholarship Committee and approved by the full PGRT Board.

Recipients of the PGRT Board Scholarship will be notified following the PGRT Board meeting in December. The PGRT Board Scholarship will be valid from the start of the new calendar year through December 31.

Recipients of a Financial Assistance Scholarship or a General Scholarship will be notified in the month following receipt of their application. These scholarships will be valid for one year following notice of award.

Criteria & Eligibility

- Applications are open to all nonprofit and allied professionals (attorneys, financial planners, accountants, trust officers)
- Applicants should have a demonstrated interest in gift planning or are seeking to further their learning in this field
- Applicants must have held their current role for one year
- Preference may be given to those who are new to the field, actively pursuing work in gift planning, and/or are working with small/reduced budgets.
- Preference (as noted) will be given to individuals (and organizations) who have not been a PGRT member or received a scholarship previously. Past members are eligible.
- Recipients will commit to attending PGRT programs and at the conclusion of the scholarship, recipients will be encouraged to maintain their PGRT membership.
