## Overview

**Thanks to the generosity of the PGRT Board,** PGRT Scholarships are available for nonprofit professionals, small-shop and independent allied professionals, or fundraising/allied professionals new to the field of planned giving. **PGRT scholarships provide the recipient with a one-year PGRT membership, valid for 12 months from the date of the award.** By accepting a PGRT Scholarship, the recipient agrees to regularly attend PGRT events and consider involvement and support in the efforts of PGRT's Board taskforces in the areas of Membership, Marketing and Communications, and Programming during their scholarship.

## Available Scholarships

**Number Available:** Up to 5 (five)

**Application Deadline:** December 31, 2023

**Criteria:** For members and non members.

Please note in your application if you work for an organization or business that has reduced or eliminated professional membership dues from budgets

**Value:** \$100 (current PGRT annual dues)

## Selection Process

All PGRT Scholarship recipients will be reviewed by PGRT's Scholarship Committee and approved by the full PGRT Board.

Recipients of the PGRT Scholarship will be notified following the PGRT Board meeting in December 2022. The PGRT Scholarship will be valid from the start of the new calendar year through December 31.

## Criteria & Eligibility

- Applications are open to all nonprofit and allied professionals (attorneys, financial planners, accountants, trust officers).
- Applicants should have a demonstrated interest in gift planning or are seeking to further their learning in this field.
- Applicants must have held their current role for one year.
- Preference may be given to those who are new to the field, actively pursuing work in gift planning, and/or are working with small/reduced budgets.
- Preference may be given to individuals (and organizations) who have not been a PGRT member or received a scholarship previously. Past members are eligible.
- Recipients will commit to attending PGRT programs and at the conclusion of the scholarship, recipients will be encouraged to maintain their PGRT membership.
